

For Reflection:

We wish to reach heaven, therefore we must be prepared to follow Christ; we must not allow others to lead us astray but be prepared and determined to conquer and resist our own evil inclinations also.

Today's good news

The first reading is taken from the Book of Numbers. The book of Numbers is a narrative of the 39 years the Israelites spent wandering in the wilderness. Today's reading comes from the account of the journey through the wilderness.

The second reading is from the Epistle of St. James. The main purpose of this epistle is the teaching of morality and self-discipline. The sacred writer speaks with great severity, not mincing his words, in order to make people see that actions of the kind he condemns are incompatible with the profession of the Christian faith.

The Gospel is from St. Mark. There are two very practical lessons we must learn from today's Gospel: the grave obligation we have of not causing scandal to our fellow-Christians or indeed to any man or woman and secondly, the willingness we should have to sacrifice any earthly possession which is a cause of sin to us.

Scandal, the sin of being a cause or an occasion of another's sin, is doubly sinful involving one's own sin and the sin of the person scandalized. Scandal can be caused by word—that is, by teaching or propagating wrong doctrine or by giving sinful advice, and it can be caused by one's own sinful deeds which may be imitated by others. Those in positions of authority such as parents whose duty it is to bring up their children in the Christian faith, are especially liable to give scandal if they fail to live truly Christian lives. Christian parents who fail to live according to their faith will be held accountable not only for their own sins, but for the sins of their children and perhaps their children's children for generations to come.

Let parents see to it that they will not be a cause of scandal and a cause of eternal loss to the children God put into their charge. The second lesson for all of us in today's Gospel is that we should ever realize that eternal life is worth any sacrifice which we may be called on to make. The road we have to travel in life is not an easy one. As our Lord says in another place: "Enter by the narrow gate for the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. But the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few"

Memorial to the Guardian Angels
October 2nd

Angels are servants and messengers
from God. "Angel" in Greek means
messenger. In unseen ways the angels
help us on our earthly pilgrimage by
assisting us in work and study, helping
us in temptation and protecting us
from physical danger.



Each person on earth has a guardian
angel who watches over him and helps him to attain his
salvation. It has been a common theological opinion that
this angelical guardianship begins at the moment of birth;
prior to this, the child would be protected by the mother's
guardian angel. But this is not certain, and since we now
know that the soul is infused at the moment of concep-
tion, it may be that the angelic guardianship also begins
at that moment.

In any case, this protection continues throughout our
whole life and ceases only when our probation on earth
ends, namely, at the moment of death. Our guardian an-
gel accompanies our soul to purgatory or heaven, and
becomes our coheir in the heavenly kingdom.

"See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I
say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon
the face of my heavenly Father"

"Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and
shepherd leading him to life"

*Angel of God, my Guardian dear, to whom His love com-

St. Therese of the Child Jesus
The Little Flower



Marie Therese Martin was born at Alencon, France on January 2, 1873, the youngest of five daughters. Her father, Louis, was a watchmaker, and her mother, Zelie, who died of breast cancer when Therese was four, was a lace maker. She was brought up in a model Christian home.

While still a child she felt the attraction of the cloister, and at fifteen obtained permission to enter the Carmel of Lisieux. For the next nine years she lived a very ordinary religious life. There are no miracles, exploits or austerities recorded of her. She attained a very high degree of holiness by carrying out her ordinary daily duties with perfect fidelity, having a childlike confidence in God's providence and merciful love and being ready to be at the service of others at all times.


She also had a great love of the Church and a zeal for the conversion of souls. *She prayed especially for priests.* She died of consumption on September 30, 1897, at the age of 24, and was canonized in 1925. She has never ceased to fulfill her promise: "I will pass my heaven in doing good on earth." Her interior life is known through her autobiography called *Story of a Soul*. Pope Saint John Paul II declared her a Doctor of the Church in 1997.

Ill-gotten Gains

Most of us own more than we need. Our closets, garages, and basements are filled with purchases once deemed important, now in disarray. Our wardrobe includes garments we haven't worn in years, clothes that would not fit anymore, or that are no longer in style. We have multiplied the televisions and cars in every home.

If you had it to do again, could you have put the money elsewhere? Could you have shared a lot more with those who have a lot less?

The Letter of James goes after the rich, painting a gloomy picture of their wealth: "Your wealth has rotted away, your clothes have become moth-eaten, your gold and silver have corroded."

The real problem with the rich of his day was their ill-gotten gains. They withheld wages from the workers who harvested their fields. They condemned and murdered the righteous who offered no resistance. The rich lived in luxury at the expense of the poor.

The gap between rich and poor is still a scandal. But even in the middle, more can be done among people who consider themselves comfortable, though not necessarily rich. Our possessions weigh us down. Our gifts can lighten the load of the poor.

How do you receive your income? Do some people suffer because of the work you do? Is your income your own possession? Or are you stewards of God's bounty for the benefit of others?
