

Today's good news

The first reading is taken from Acts and the event described takes place in the middle of St. Paul's first missionary journey. Paul and Barnabas quote Isaiah 49:6 in support of their decision to preach to the Gentiles. The Isaiah text referred to Christ, ...but now Paul and Barnabas apply it to themselves because the Messiah is "light for the Gentiles" through the preaching of the Apostles, for they are conscious of speaking in Christ's name and on his authority.

The second reading is from the Book of Revelation 7. Last week we heard St. John describing his vision of the heavenly liturgy where he saw the Lamb of God in the Holy of Holies in His perpetual offering to God, the heavenly offering of Jesus Himself which we join at every Mass. Today we join St. John as he again views this heavenly liturgy and describes the Church in heaven (what we call the Church Triumphant) as it glorifies God.

The Gospel is from John . This Sunday is often called "Good Shepherd Sunday." Jesus intended the beautiful parable of the Good Shepherd with its many consoling truths and promises for men of every century, including the twentieth. We are all too prone to evaluate the words of the Gospel in an exclusively historical sense. The liturgy's primary aim is to portray the present, not the past, to give grace and life along with history. You must, therefore, give the parable a present day context, apply it personally. After each sentence stop and say: Christ is doing this today — and to help me. The parable brings to our attention three consoling truths: Christ gives His life for His sheep; He remains with them constantly through the bond of grace; He will not rest content until there be but one flock and one shepherd.

The words He spoke will never die. "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away." Christ's words are as pregnant with life now as when they were first spoken. They give us the mind of our Good Shepherd as He instructs, warns, and consoles us; they are the words of a father, a mother, a brother, a friend, a judge. Once upon a time Christ's words performed miracles, they have not lost their power! "Young man, I say to you: arise. This day you shall be with Me in paradise." Treasure Christ's words most highly.




Fortieth Anniversary of Father Chris Ordination to the Priesthood





Revelation 7:9, 14b-17

Dressed for Heaven

We do not know what we will look like in heaven. At the resurrection of the body, will we have the body of our youth? Will we look as we do when we die? These are natural questions, but eternal life will be far greater than what we can now imagine. When we are freed from time and place, we will enter the mysterious presence of God in ways more perfect than we can know.

Still, people use metaphors to envision eternal life, and the Book of Revelation is no exception. John sees a great multitude standing before the throne and the Lamb, "wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands." John saw heaven in a vision of vesture and accessories.

White robes clothe heavenly beings in several passages of the New Testament. Jesus' clothes turn white at the transfiguration. Angels clothed in white appear at the resurrection. Heavenly beings throughout the Book of Revelation wear white. This is one reason why we wear white on the day of our baptism, and why we cover a Christian's coffin with a white cloth. We are clothed already in the uniform of heaven.

The festive palm branch is a sign of the victory of eternal life. Artists throughout the ages have depicted saints carrying palms.

We do not know what we will wear or carry, but we can expect that the Lamb will shepherd us to springs of life-giving water.


