

Brighter than the sun and moon together, with a light that makes the walls of the holy city sparkle like crystal, God 's lamb shines in splendor.



Today's good news

The first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, and concerns the Council of Jerusalem which falls in the middle of the book of Acts and describes the turning point for the Church when the council officially recognized the evangelization of the Gentiles. This evangelization had been initiated by Sts. Peter, Barnabas and Paul. Thus, the Christian church broke away from the Mosaic rules while maintaining its roots in the rich theology and traditions of the chosen people.

The second reading is from the Book of Revelation 21:10-14, and continues the description of the Heavenly Jerusalem. In the heavenly Jerusalem there is no longer any need for God to have a dwelling-place, because God the Father himself and the Lamb are always present. The Godhead does not need to be brought to mind by the temple (the symbol of his invisible presence), because the blessed will always see God face to face. This sight of God is what causes the righteous to be forever happy.

The Gospel is from John 14:23-29. In the first reading at today's Mass, we were given the story of the first General Council ever held by the Church authorities. There we saw that a vital decision was reached through the guidance and assistance of the Holy Spirit. "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and ours" was how the authorities announced the conclusion they had reached. In this Gospel which we have just read, Christ promised his Apostles, the night before his death, that when he returned to the Father, the Holy Spirit would be sent to them. He would teach them all things and recall to their minds all that Christ had taught them. In other words, the Church, through the Apostles, was promised the direct assistance of the Holy Spirit in preserving and interpreting what we call "the deposit of faith" or the sum total of the divine revelation given to us for our sanctification.

That promise was fulfilled in a very solemn way within twenty years of our Lord's resurrection at the Council of Jerusalem. It has been fulfilled again and again down through the history of the Church. We should call on the Holy Spirit to help us daily, but we should call for his assistance especially when we have a serious decision to make. His role in the Church and in the lives of all Christians is to preserve and protect the revelation that God has given us. There are times in the lives of many of us when we are tempted to doubt about what we are called on to believe, or to hesitate with regard to what we are called on to do. It is on such occasions that the help of the Holy Spirit is especially necessary. He will not fail us if we turn to him earnestly and sincerely.



Sixth Sunday of Easter



During the inauguration Mass of Pope Leo XIV, two significant symbols of the papacy are presented to him: the **pallium** and the **fisherman's ring**.

The fisherman's ring represents the link with St. Peter and the pope's apostolic mission.


It is a tradition dating back to the time of Saint Peter, who was a fisherman.

Significance of the Pallium


The pallium, a significant symbol of the papal office, represents the pastoral mission of Pope Leo XIV and his connection to the Apostle Peter.

The pallium is a liturgical vestment made from the wool of lambs, symbolizing the Good Shepherd who carries his flock. It is a narrow band worn over the shoulders, featuring two black pendants and six

black silk crosses, which represent the nails of Christ's crucifixion. The pallium is traditionally conferred upon a new pope during the inauguration of his pontificate, signifying his role as a shepherd of the Church.



The coat of arms of Pope Leo XIV includes the traditional papal symbols of the crossed keys of St. Peter and episcopal mitre.



The tiara and keys remain symbols of the papacy and appear on the coat of arms of the Holy See and the flag of Vatican City³.

The Latin motto is "In illo Uno unum", meaning "In the One, we are one".

The title "doctor of the church" is granted to saints whose writings and teachings are of particular importance. 

The Ascension of the Lord May 29th

Celebrated on Sunday, **June 1st**

In 2025, the Catholic Church will celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of Jesus on Thursday, May 29, 2025.



This solemnity occurs just forty days after Easter Sunday, and thus is the culmination of Jesus' time on earth with his disciples. In some dioceses, especially in the United States, the solemnity may be transferred to the following Sunday (June 1) to allow for broader participation among the faithful


This feast is a holy day of obligation, meaning that, unless legitimately excused or otherwise dispensed, Catholics need to participate in Mass to commemorate how Jesus ascended into heaven, completing his earthly mission.

Our Diocese celebrates the Ascension on **Sunday**, **June 1st** at our normal Sunday Mass times.









Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

Lights Out



A power outage eliminates the usefulness of many appliances. Computers and mobile phones have batteries, but they have to be charged. Kitchens rely on electricity for food preparation. The garage door opener fails. And, of course, the lights go out. In fact, people sometimes describe a power outage in those terms: "Our lights went out." Much more went out, but the lights mean more to us than anything else.



In the days before electricity, the sun and the moon provided much-needed light. Without them, life would be unthinkable. The night brought terrors and insecurities long forgotten by more civilized societies.



So when the Book of Revelation envisions living in a world without sun and moon, the image is inconceivable. But here was a city gleaming like a jewel, fortified with walls, and penetrated by twelve magnificently harmonious gates, named for the tribes of Israel. Revelation says the heavenly bodies served no luminous purpose for this new Jerusalem. "The glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb." No other light was needed.



Each of us has known a time when the glory of God was our only light. Our lives were dimmed by loss of income, friends, authority—or electrical power.



When the light of our eyes finally closes, when the gathering darkness of death envelopes us, one light shall shine to dispel our fear and bring us home: the light of Christ.


