

One in the Spirit, we turn our attention to the needs of the world, our community, and all around us.



Today's good news

After Jesus had ascended to heaven from Mt. Olivet, the apostles and disciples returned to the Holy City. They remained together in the Upper Room or Cenacle, the place where Jesus had appeared to them and which may well be called the first Christian church. About a hundred and twenty persons were assembled there. They chose Matthias as an apostle in place of the unhappy Judas; they prayed and waited for the Paraclete.

Ten days had passed, it was Sunday, the seventh Sunday after the resurrection. At about nine o'clock in the morning, as they were together praying fervently, the Holy Spirit descended upon them. Note how all the great theophanies in Christ's life occurred during the course of prayer. Pentecost followed precedent. The small community of Christians had prepared themselves through prayer for the coming of the Paraclete.

The descent upon the apostles was internal and invisible in nature although accompanied by certain visible phenomena. There came a mighty roar, like the onrush of a violent wind. It came suddenly, from heaven; but unlike storms that strike a structure from without, this one penetrated and filled the room where the disciples were gathered. Therefore it was not a natural wind, it was a miracle peculiar to the occasion. A second visible sign consisted in tongues of fire that descended upon each one present. These fiery tongues gave visible evidence that the Holy Spirit had descended upon them.

Today at Mass, particularly at holy Communion, the power of the Holy Spirit will come down upon us; fiery tongues will not be seen, but invisible tongues of fire will not be absent. There was still another external manifestation of the Holy Spirit; the apostles and disciples were enabled to speak various languages.

Yes, even we as individuals have a gift of tongues which all men can understand. It is the gift of love infused into us by the Holy Spirit. Love unites, love is a common language, by means of love we can speak to all nations.

June Dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The remainder of the month falls within the liturgical season of Ordinary Time, which is represented

by the liturgical color green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. It is used in the offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.

The last portion of the liturgical year represents the time of our pilgrimage to heaven during which we hope for reward.




Adult Bible Study





Pentecost Sunday

What does the name "Pentecost" mean?

It comes from the Greek word for "fiftieth". The reason is that Pentecost is the fiftieth day (after Easter Sunday (on the Christian calendar).

This name came into use in the late Old Testament period and was inherited by the authors of the New Testament.

> What kind of feast was Pentecost in the Old Testament?

It was a harvest festival, signifying the end of the grain harvest.

Deuteronomy 16 states:

You shall count seven weeks; begin to count the seven weeks from the time you first put the sickle to the standing grain.



This contains two notable symbols of the Holy Spirit and his activity: the elements of wind and fire.

Is there a connection between the "tongues" of fire and the speaking in other "tongues" in this pas-

Yes. In both cases, the Greek word for "tongues" is the same, and the reader is meant to understand the connection.

The word "tongue" is used to signify both an individual flame and an individual language.

The "tongues as of fire" (i.e., individual flames) are distributed to and rest on the disciples, thus empowering them to miraculously speak in "other tongues" (i.e., languages).

A Prayer to the Holy Spirit

Breathe on me, breathy of God, Fill me with life anew, That I may love the things you love. And do wȟat you would do.

Breathe on me, breath of God, *Until my heart is pure,* Until with you I have one will, To live and to endure.

> Breathe on me, breath of God, *My soul with grace divine,* Until this earthly part of me, Glows with your fire divine.

Breathe on me, breathy of God So I shall never die, But live with you the perfect life, *In your eternity.*

What else is this feast known as?

In the Old Testament, it is referred to by several names: The feast of weeks; The feast of harvest; The day of first-fruits

In England (and English), it has also been known as "Whitsunday" (white Sunday). This name is presumably derived from the white baptismal garments of those recently baptized

How is the Holy Spirit symbolized in the events of the day of Pentecost?

Acts 2 records:

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them.

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues.



What does Pentecost represent in the New Testament?

It represents the fulfillment of Christ's promise from the end of Luke's Gospel: "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.

And behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city, until you are clothed with power from on high" [Lk. 24:46-49].

Sharing the Spirit

The Holy Spirit gives us every good gift. The Spirit gives us faith. The Spirit enriches our lives with the grace of God. The Spirit lies beneath the charisms we have—the particular gifts that build up the Body of Christ, however we choose to serve.

Perhaps the Spirit's greatest gift is preparing us for eternal life with C Christ. Paul writes to the Romans, "If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit that dwells in you." The same Spirit who gave life to Christ will also give life to us. The Father, whose Spirit dwelled in Jesus, sends the same Spirit into the hearts of those who believe.

This Pentecost recalls the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles long ago, but it also celebrates the coming of the Spirit into the church today. That Spirit enriches each of us in many ways—through our faith, our charisms, and the promise of eternal life.

This Pentecost, let us open our hearts to that Spirit. Let us accept the work of the Spirit in others and release it within ourselves. Let us live in the Spirit that we might die in the Spirit. On that great day we will be joint heirs with Christ as we sing praise to the Father, in the Spirit for ever.
