

The Epistle points to these interior and social aspects of the "Christ" way: interiorly, by prayer, to "glorify" the Fatherhood of God; socially by our actions, to "receive one another" in the Brotherhood of Man, "even as Christ has received you."



### Today's good news

"As the journey of Advent continues, as we prepare to celebrate the nativity of Christ, John the Baptist's call to conversion sounds out in our communities. It is a pressing invitation to open our hearts and to welcome the Son of God Who comes among us to make divine judgement manifest. The Father, writes St. John the Evangelist, does not judge anyone, but has entrusted the power of judgement to the Son, because He is the Son of man.

"And it is today, in the present, that we decide our future destiny. It is with our concrete everyday behavior in this life that we determine our eternal fate. At the end of our days on earth, at the moment of death, we will be evaluated on the basis of our likeness or otherwise to the Baby Who is about to be born in the poor grotto of Bethlehem, because He is the measure God has given humanity.

Jesus referred John as "My messenger" who prepared the "way". John now wanted his disciples to realize that they, too, must follow Christ in this "way". Only through the same Jesus Christ, the long expected Savior, will the "blind" of soul "see;" the "lame' of character "walk;" the "lepers" of sin become "cleansed;" the "poor" become rich with a new Gospel.

"Through the Gospel John the Baptist continues to speak down the centuries to each generation. His hard clear words bring health to us, the men and women of this day in which even the experience and perception of Christmas often, unfortunately, reflects materialist attitudes. The 'voice' of the great prophet asks us to prepare the way for the coming Lord in the deserts of today, internal and external deserts, thirsting for the water of life which is Christ".



dogma defined by Blessed Pope Pius IX in 1854, was transferred from the 8th because of the Sunday Liturgy.

Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception.

That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Blessed Pope Pius IX proclaimed on December 8, 1854: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin."

This is a Holy Day of Obligation.

St. Nicholas, Bishop and Confessor

Not much is known about this 4th century bishop, but that doesn't diminish his popularity around the world, both in the East and West. It is known that Nicholas



was born in Lycia in Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey) and died in 352 A.D. as the Bishop of Myra. All other stories that surround Nicholas illustrate that he practiced both the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. He was generous, strove to help the poor and disadvantaged, and worked tirelessly to defend the faith. His legends of generosity and a slip of the tongue from other languages has made St. Nicholas or Sinterklaas into today's Santa Claus.

St Nicolas will be outside of the church this weekend to offer candy to the children.



On the evergreen trees on either side of the doors in the Narthex will be trees with tags with the sex and ages of children from 3 months to teen years.




Please take a tag or two and purchase a toy for the children that come to our Food Pantry.

**Good Memories** 

The memory of good times helps us through the bad times. Sometimes we wonder if we have enough strength to go on, enough charity to be kind again today, enough hope for tomorrow. The memory of good times in the past can give us strength to be virtuous. We know that adversity in the past has made us who we are today. We believe that the adversity of today will make us better for tomorrow.


God has promised good times. God made this promise through many generations of the chosen people. When they were beset by loss of property, exile, and the death of those they loved, they often wondered what their future would be. But God promised better days. They knew from the past that God delivered on promises like this, and they found hope for the present.

The promises of God were so sacred that they became our Scriptures. Saint Paul says, "Whatever was written previously was written for our instruction, that by endurance and by the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope." By examining God's past promises, we take comfort. We know that even in the midst of adversity, we are still held in God's hands.

Jesus came to confirm God's promises to the patriarchs. During Advent we hear these promises over and over again. They prepare us for the joy of Christmas. God had prepared the way for Christ, and God is still guiding the church that is Christ's body.

# Second Sunday of Advent



On this second **Sunday of Advent** we are preparing for the coming of the Christ child: a child born on the road, in a town that had no room for him.

As Catholics, we have been taught that hospitality for the migrant is part of the fabric of our belief. Our scriptures tell us that nations are judged by how we treat our anawim - the widows, orphans and migrants in our midst. We are told, "care for the migrants, for you yourselves were once migrants." (Deuteronomy 10:18-19) Elsewhere we hear, "pay attention to the strangers in your midst for you may have unknowingly entertained angels." (Hebrews 13:2)

Yet some will ask, "do we have to care of those who are not following our rules?" In the midst of this lament, these readings invite us to pause and reflect. We have to look beyond the political landscape and dig deeply into our own actions to search our hearts and return to God.

Prayer, fervent prayer, is critical in the movement from despair to hope. We must be filled with prayer for one another, and pray always for love. We pray that our love may increase to help us

discern what is of value.

We are being asked to remember to hope, to pray, to repent and to stand with the prophets crying out in the wilderness. We are reminded to love, to be a light in the darkness as a sign of God's hope, to prepare a way for the Lord, not only during Advent, but vigilantly, fervently, every day.
