For Reflection:

True and loyal service of God therefore begins in the heart and has its value from this interior disposition. Keeping the ten commandments is our way of proving to God that we are grateful, obedient and loyal to him who gave us all we have and who has promised us future gifts infinitely greater still.



Today's good news

The first reading is taken from Sirach 15:15-20. Today's reading comes from the section of Sirach's writing on man's free will and responsibility.

The second reading is from St. Paul 1 Corinthians 2:6-10. Last week we heard Saint Paul address how his preaching illustrates the fact that man's strength and wisdom are nothing compared to those of God. Today we hear him tell of the true wisdom of God.

The Gospel is from St. Matthew 5:17-37. In this Sermon on the Mount, we have various sayings of Christ, actually spoken on different occasions. Matthew, in his systematic manner, has gathered these sayings into one continuous discourse here. This makes it easier for his readers, who were Jewish converts, to grasp the new order of salvation as inaugurated by Christ. They knew the ten commandments, but they knew them as their rabbis had taught them. These rabbis, for the most part Pharisees, put all the stress on the letter of the law and on its external observance. Christ's opening statement, that the attitude of his followers towards the commandments (and other precepts of the law) must be different, and superior to that of the scribes and Pharisees, clearly indicates how Christianity must differ from, and supersede, Judaism.

Christ is not abolishing the ten commandments, but he is demanding of his followers a more perfect, a more sincere, fulfillment of them. Avoiding murder therefore is not enough; the true Christian must remove any inclination to murder by building up true, brotherly love for all men in his heart.

We must not only not injure our neighbor or fellowman in his person, or in his character, but we must be ever ready to help him and prevent injury to him, whenever and wherever we can. We must not only not commit adultery, but must also develop a Christian respect and esteem for purity, the virtue which will preserve us not only from adultery but even from thoughts of adultery, or any other abuse of our sexual gifts given us by God for his sublime purpose.

We must be truthful always, and men of our word. This virtue is not only necessary for man's salvation, but is the basis of rational intercourse between men in civilized society. While our civil courts still deem it necessary to impose oaths on contestants and witnesses (since they have, unfortunately, to take account of the liars and deceivers who still are a menace to society), the truthful man need not be afraid of insulting or dishonoring God by calling him as his guarantor, if asked to do so.





## Focus On the Cross

As we focus on the crucifixion of Christ during this time of Lent, we often see the letters **INRI** above the head of Jesus.



INRI stems from the Latin phrase 'Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudeorum' meaning 'Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews'.

This was the notice Pontius Pilate nailed over Jesus as he lay dying on the cross. (Latin does not use a 'J' and interchanges with an 'I')

It was common for the Romans to hang a "**titulus**" or sign above the crucified to indicate the charges against him. scripture says that Pilate put the charges in Latin, Greek and Hebrew.

In fact, the remnants of the titulus which hung above the Savior's head, as he offered Himself upon the Cross, is kept in the Church of Santa Croce in Jerusalem in Rome.




## Sermon on the Mount Beatitudes

These are the blessings that Jesus talked about in the Sermon on the Mount, and they offer a code, one which is inviting rather than prohibitive:



- 🕊 Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

- 🕊 Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.
- 🕊 Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.
- 🕊 Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.
- 🕊 Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.
- 🕊 Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.
- 🕊 Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- 🕊 Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.

## The Three Pillars of Lent



**About Fasting** Fasting among Christians is a penitential discipline intended to open our hearts to God and others, a meaning of purification and spiritual liberation, a witness of the depth of our Faith.

The law of abstinence from meat binds those who are 14 and older; Meatless Fridays are a timeless tradition in the Catholic Church.

The simple act of abstaining from meat joins us to the sacrificial heart of Jesus. We encourage every parishioner to adopt this penitential practice on the Fridays during Lent.

The law of fasting binds those from 18 to 59 years of age. Two smaller meals are allowed as needed, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Only one full meal is allowed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday which are Universal days of Fasting and Abstinence.

Lent prepares the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection.

It is a time for reflection and spiritual renewal, a time to examine one's relationships with God and with others.

The Church also calls Catholics to a spirit of penance, above all fasting, prayer and almsgiving, "which express conversion in relation to oneself, to God, and to others"

### Expert Advice

An expert can quickly solve problems you may spend hours trying to figure out. If you cannot get the software to work on your computer, for example, you might waste a lot of time trying to figure out what is wrong. But someone who knows the software can fix it up in a snap. The same is true of everyday crises from car repair to plumbing. Experts seem to have a different kind of wisdom. We are blessed when they share it.

We each have some wisdom we can share, too. Other people need our experience, advice, and love. Each of us has solved some of life's problems in a way that would help some others to know.

It is most true of God. God has a wisdom beyond what we have learned. The puzzles of life cannot be solved by our own experience or reason. Some things we turn over to the maker of life, trusting in the divine plan.

Paul tells the Corinthians, "We speak God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, which God predetermined before the ages for our glory." God has prepared things for us that we cannot experience now. Our sight and hearing help us appreciate the world around us, but in the end they will fail. God's goodness is beyond what we can imagine.

When we need an expert, someone to help us solve the puzzles of life, we turn ourselves over to the wisdom of God.
