For Reflection:

Jesus carried out his mission all over Galilee. His disciples have followed his example. Now, we are his disciples, asked to embrace the lost and troubled, and to give hope to the weary.



Today's good news

The First Reading is taken from the *Book of Exodus 19:2-6a*. This reading is a preliminary to the Sinai covenant where Israel is dearer to Yahweh than any other nation; Israel is to become a kingdom of priests, a holy nation. They needed to grow in holiness and to become a mission-oriented group rather than remain a self-contained body. Israel was specially chosen and enjoyed God's favor, but that election was not to mean isolation and self-satisfaction.

The Second Reading is from the *Letter of St. Paul to the Romans 5:6-11*. In this reading St. Paul argues from the fact that if God was so good to us as to let his Son die for us while we were yet sinners, we can have the greatest confidence that he will also bring us to heaven (provided we keep our part of the contract) when our earthly life ends, because as followers of Christ we are now adopted sons

The Gospel is from *St. Matthew 9:36, 10:8*. "Jesus had compassion for them." Who were the "crowds" on whom he had compassion? Among them were tax-collectors who cheated, robbers who robbed, murderers who murdered, harlots who lived lives of unchastity, adulterers who violated their marriage vows, nominal believers in God who never went to the temple or honored God in private. Yet Jesus, who read their innermost minds, had pity on them for he saw that most, if not all of these sinners, acted through ignorance and through lack of instruction.

Christ too is unchanged. He still has compassion for today's sinners and wants them to be saved, not lost. But for this he needs "harvesters," apostles, who will help him. Here is where all good Christians, all who really love God and their neighbor, must help. He is not asking us to give up our present occupation, or to leave home and family to become priests or missionaries. The first movement towards this apostolate to our fellow men is to show the good example of a truly Christian life. In the home and in our place of employment, example may go unnoticed or sometimes even be ridiculed by the very ones who need it, but with the grace of God, which always accompanies it, it will eventually produce good fruit. There are thousands of men and women in heaven today who owe their salvation, under God, to the good example of a sincere Christian neighbor. sinner least of all, wants to be lectured or "preached at." St. Francis de Sales, the gentlest of apostles, said that one will catch more flies with a spoonful of honey than with a barrel of vinegar. There are pious Christians who abhor sin so much that they abhor and repel the sinner, as well.

In this, they are more pharisaical than Christlike. He abhorred sin, but he still loved the sinner and wanted him saved.

God never tires of showing his mercy : Words from Pope Leo

In his video message, the Pope underlined how in "today's world, with its many fears and anxieties, tensions and wars" there is "an increasingly urgent need for peace in the hearts of both individuals and peoples."

"God never tires of showing His mercy," the Pope insisted, adding that His love "endures forever, and how much our world is crying out for mercy at every level!"

Quoting St. Augustine who said that his only hope was in "God's exceeding great mercy," the Pope highlighted that, indeed, it is a source of joy and hope "when we experience how merciful God is towards each one of us."

However, he explained that the peace "we so deeply desire cannot be attained without mercy."

"Let us therefore join our trust in the infinite mercy of God with our own personal commitment to build a more welcoming and merciful society, beginning with our families," he urged.

He concluded by encouraging those present to then bring back to their communities all they gathered from this international meeting and by imparting his Apostolic Blessing.

Book of Exodus 19:2-6a.

Jesus sends his disciples to share their faith with others, but they are initially instructed to focus on the people of Israel.

We often pray to sustain ourselves, unaware that God intends to send us out to proclaim the gospel with a mission.

The message of good news, as stated in the book of Acts and other gospels, is the core message that has always been there.

The good news is not well articulated.

The kerygma, or proclamation of the Gospel, is a simple message that can be shared with others, and its core is what we need to focus on.

God loves you and has an amazing plan for your life, a message the world desperately needs to hear, especially in times of addiction and turmoil.

God loves you, sin ruined His plan, but Jesus' death offers redemption from sin.

The core message of the Gospel is that through baptism, we are saved, conformed to Christ, and receive the virtues of faith, hope, and charity, and sharing this radical reorienting of life to Jesus can be a powerful call to repentance.
